**Sats (standard assessment tests) are Y6 tests administered over four days (Monday 12<sup>th</sup> May to Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> May 2025) They are designed to measure children's attainment in maths and english.**

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# Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

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- A test is given on Punctuation, Vocabulary and Grammar
- This test lasts for 45 minutes and requires short answer questions, including some multiple choice. 50 questions, worth 50 marks.
- A Spelling test is administered containing 20 words, lasting approximately 15 minutes. 20 marks
- Marks for these two tests are added together to give a total for Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar.

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# Reading

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- The Reading Test consists of a single test paper with three unrelated reading texts.
- Children are given 60 minutes in total, which includes reading the texts and answering the questions.
- A total of 50 marks are available.
- Questions are designed to assess the comprehension and understanding of a child's reading.
- Some questions are multiple choice or selected response, others require short answers and some require an extended response or explanation.

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# Mathematics

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- Children will sit three tests: Paper 1, Paper 2 and Paper 3.
- Paper 1 is for 'Arithmetic' lasting for 30 minutes, covering calculation methods for all operations, including use of fractions, percentages and decimals.
- Questions gradually increase in difficulty. Not all children will be expected to access some of the more difficult questions later in the paper.
- Papers 2 and 3 cover 'Problem Solving and Reasoning', each lasting for 40 minutes.
- Pupils will still require calculation skills but will need to answer questions in context and decide what is required to find a solution.

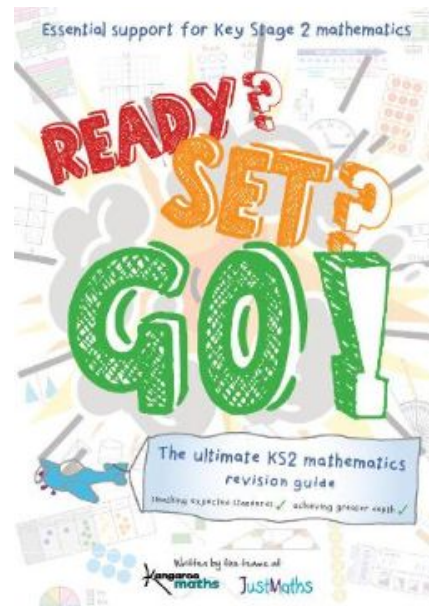
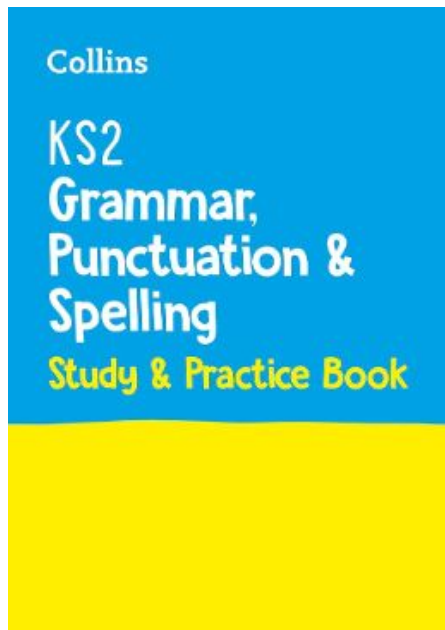
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# Revision Guides

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# Do SATs matter?

- Prepare for secondary school  
SATs help students develop the basic skills they need for secondary school, like reading, writing, and maths.
- Identify areas for improvement  
SATs results can help students identify their strengths and weaknesses, which can help them in secondary school.
- Predict GCSE results  
SATs results can help predict how well a student will perform in GCSE exams.
- Introduce students to formal exams  
SATs help students get used to the experience of taking formal exams, which can help them prepare for future exams.



# How to Help Your Child

- First and foremost, support and reassure your child that there is nothing to worry about and they should always just try their best. Praise and encourage!
- Ensure your child has the best possible attendance at school.
- Support your child using SAT's revision books.
- Reading, spelling and arithmetic (e.g. times tables - TT Rockstars, Spelling Shed)) are always good to practise.
- Talk to your child about what they have learnt at school and what book(s) they are reading (the character, the plot, their opinion).
- Make sure your child has a good sleep and healthy breakfast every morning!

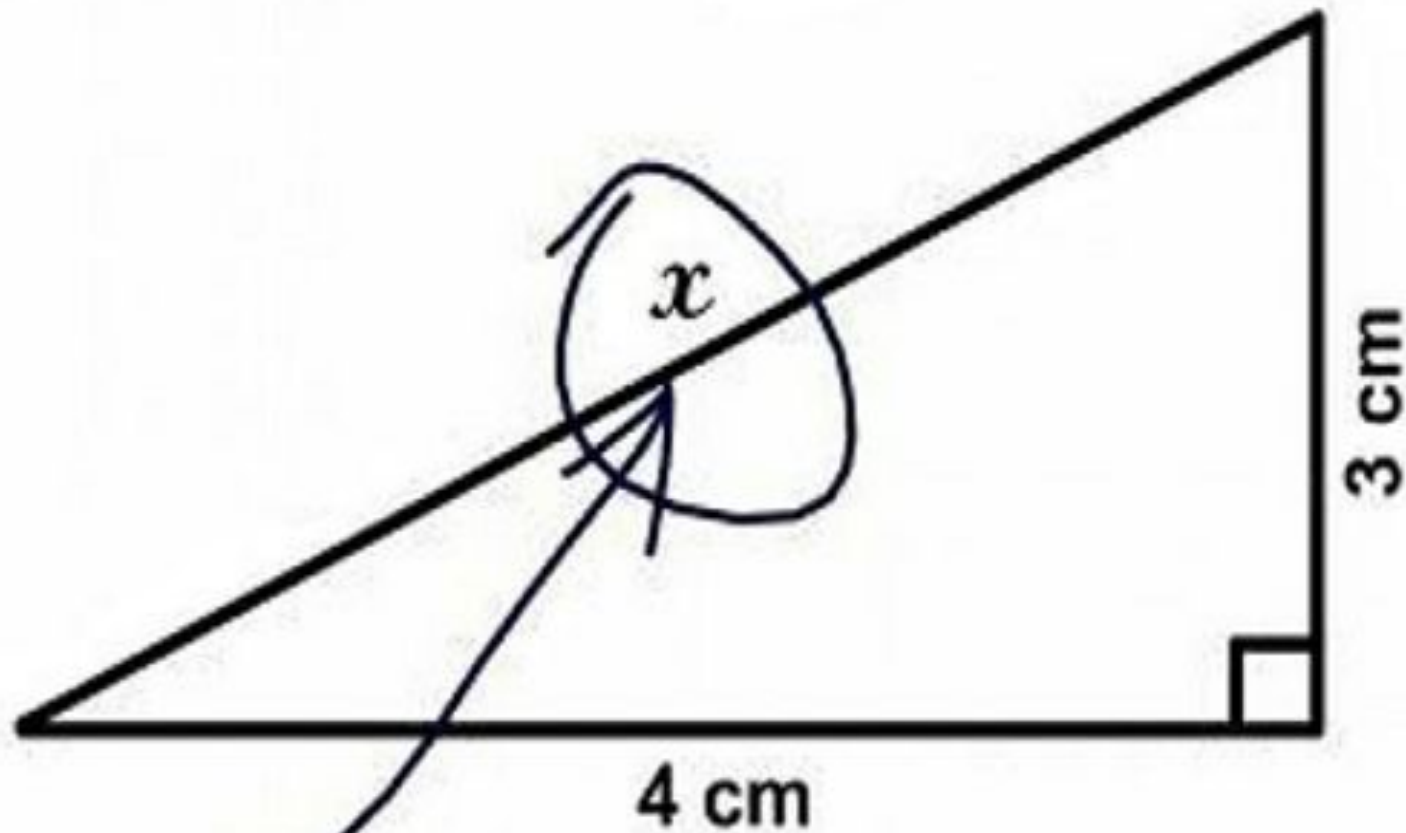
